WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

Scouters age 18 or older who are interested in learning in-depth about the principles of Leave No Trace and their application, teaching them to others through Awareness courses, and running Leave No Trace Trainer courses in their Districts and Councils.

- The course is open to registered BSA members who are at least 18 years of age by the start of the course.
- BSA Annual Health and Medical Record, Parts A, B, and C, required
- First Aid/Wilderness First Aid recommended



WHY ATTEND?

This is a field-based training experience, with a focus on bringing the message of Leave No Trace to others in Scouting.

The Leave No Trace Seven Principles

1. Plan Ahead and Prepare
2. Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces
3. Dispose of Waste Properly
4. Leave What You Find
5. Minimize Campfire Impacts
6. Respect Wildlife
7. Be Considerate of Other Visitors

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DID YOU KNOW?
