

Scout Law



Managing Risk to be Physically and Medically Prepared

High-adventure trips are physically demanding and have inherent risks, and each crew member needs to understand how to mitigate these risks.


Identify Medical Issues

-complete the AHMR

-identify risk factors

-have an open conversation with your medical professional.
